


Promoting Regular and Ongoing Curriculum Review Cycles



Curriculum Review Cycles

Leaders and teachers must evaluate and regularly review the quality of the written curriculum.



Determine the overarching topic and identify the focus questions



Gather the data that will inform your review based on your questions

The initial curriculum process includes the framework of articulating your purpose, setting curriculum goals and designing a unit template.



Closely study, ask questions and make observations of the data



Draw conclusions and determine actionable steps for continued growth




Share findings, results and next steps

Regular and ongoing review cycles are a critical component and should be thoughtfully included in the written plan for curriculum development.
